

# **ANSO approves ANSO-DRR**

The establishment of the Alliance of International Science Organizations on Disaster Risk Reduction (ANSO-DRR) was first presented during the 1st Discussion Meeting at the Beijing International Convention Center last May 11, 2019. ANSO-DRR was able to identify the following key areas of opportunities that the new alliance can work on: DRR focus along the land-based and maritime routes in belt and road countries; building effective collaboration between participating communities; focus on disaster resilience of infrastructures; and contribute to innovations in higher education and entrepreneurship.

On December 3, 2019, the Alliance of International Science Organizations (ANSO) officially reviewed ANSO-DRR's proposal, which included the concept of ANSO-DRR, how the new Alliance can add value to ANSO, and the work plan and target achievements for the next three years.

ANSO officially accepted the proposal of ANSO-DRR on December 11, 2019, with Prof. Peng CUI and Prof. Gretchen Kalonji (image on the right) as co-Chairs for the first three years.

# What is ANSO-DRR

ANSO-DRR is an **international**, **non-profit**, and **non-governmental** scientific alliance jointly created by the *Institute of Mountain Hazards* and Environment of the Chinese Academy of Sciences, the Institute for Disaster Management and Reconstruction of Sichuan University, with other international scientific organizations, academies and universities which share strong interests in the field of disaster risk reduction, and strong geographic focus on the Belt and Road regions.

It is a collaboration platform for sustainable development, to better promote the implementation of the *Sendai Framework for Disaster Reduction* 2015-2030 and the *2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development* in countries in the Belt and Road regions.







## **Promotional Activities**

Last July 2019, ANSO-DRR conducted the 2019 Summer School of Silk Road Disaster Risk Reduction (top). The program, hosted by IMHE, training for international students coming from the Belt and Road regions.

The Alliance was represented at the Coordinators' Meeting on Belt and Road Seismic Reduction held during the 2019 International Workshop on Models Collaboration on Multinational Resilience (center).

ANSO-DRR also contributed to the 2<sup>nd</sup> International Workshop for Youth and Young Professionals in Disaster Prevention and Reduction organized by IDMR on December 6 - 8, 2019, in collaboration with IRDR and U-Inspire Alliance (bottom). conference brought together more than 50 experts, young scholars, and students from world-class universities and research institutions in 19 countries. Lastly, the construction of ANSO-DRR website has already started and is expected to go online in the coming months.

## **ANSO-DRR Webinar**

Due to the influence of COVID-19, the Alliance of International Science Organizations on Disaster Risk Reduction (ANSO-DRR) hosted a Webinar for its 2<sup>nd</sup> Discussion Meeting last May 18, 2020. Over 50 attendees from 15 countries participated in the said event. Prof. Ailikun, the Assistant Executive Director of ANSO Secretariat, discussed how to promote international cooperation in Science and Innovation for global benefits.

Ideas regarding the strategic development of ANSO-DRR, especially in the midst of COVID-19 were raised during the said webinar. Data collection on existing mechanisms and changes in each member's agenda in relation to COVID-19 was identified as an essential step in order to move forward.

Finally, the members of the Steering Committee were introduced. The committee will be responsible in guiding ANSO-DRR in the coming years.
